## OUR JUDGES

### ■ Gail Nel (SACC)

I qualified as an All Breeds Judge in September 1994, and have been breeding and showing cats for some 25 years. I have been Chairlady of the Transvaal Cat Society for 19 years, and was actively involved in stewarding and on various Cat Club Committees before that.



I am a single mom with 16-year-old twin daughters, Ashleigh and Brittany, and currently own 13 cats, including seven Orientals and six Maine Coons. I am Client Services Director of an Advertising Agency, Ochre Media, in Johannesburg.

I started showing a Tortiepoint Siamese many years ago, and then acquired my first Oriental Havana from Dumas Cattery. I bred Supreme Champion Westwood's Mr Mistoffelees, who went on to become SACC Neuter of the Year two years in a row. I still breed under the Westwood Cattery name and breed both Orientals/Siamese and Maine Coons, and have bred many Supreme Champions in both breeds.

I have judged all over South Africa and also in Zimbabwe; and I have judged in Perth, Brisbane, Adelaide, Melbourne and Launceston in Australia, as well as in New Zealand during the past eight years. I am a member of Cat Judges Incorporated Panel of Judges (CJI), which is a SACC-affiliated panel, where I am involved in the training and mentoring of new judges.

### ■ Peter Williams (GCCF)

Peter is a Burmese breeder and a Burmese & Cornish/Devon Rex Judge licensed with the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy, the premier registering body for breeding and showing cats in the UK. Currently he is a resident of South Melbourne in Victoria.



### ■ Wendy Hamilton (NSWCFA)

My first purebred cat was, like so many people years ago, a seal point Siamese. Not a showgirl but a wonderful introduction to pedigree cats. After visiting my first cat show, it was the brown Burmese that I fell in love with, so in 1977 I purchased my first breeding girl and registered my **Zarlee**



prefix. I exhibited and bred Burmese of all colours for 10 years, winning Best in Show a number of times. However it was during this time I saw my first Birman cat and I was hooked! So it was in 1982 that a seal point Birman joined my family and that is still my breed today. I am pleased to have achieved Best in Show awards with my Birmans both here and overseas. (Although our home is still ruled by a regal Siamese!)

My love of all cats led me into the realm of judging and in 1997 I attained my Group 1 licence and in 2001, I passed my group 2 licence exam. I am proud to be a Life member of the Birman Cat Club of Australia. I have been fortunate to have judged around much of Australia as well as New Zealand and in doing so, have been privileged to have handled some truly beautiful felines.

### ■ Fiona Mangan (NSWCFA)

Animals have always been important in my life. After growing up in the company of greyhounds, whippets and a succession of cats of varying descriptions, I became interested in cats in a serious way after forming a liaison with my first Abyssinians, a tawny and a silver, in 1989. Initially, it was just an involvement in showing cats. Breeding them soon followed, specializing in Silver Abyssinians under the **Nivalis** prefix. Today, even though we have a multi-cat household, each of them is allotted time according to their need to love and be loved. All cats are special and each is unique, regardless of their origins.



I am a member of a variety of cat clubs and have, for many years, been actively involved with the Abyssinian Cat Club serving in various roles including President, Secretary, Treasurer and Show Manager. For several years I have been active as an approved steward, qualified as a Companion Exhibit Judge in 2003 and as a group 3 Judge in 2009.

### ■ Chris Buckley (NSWCFA)

Chris, a very experienced steward of many years standing, successfully completed the NSW C.F.A. Companion Judges Course in mid 2003. He and his partner, Brenda, own a tribe of Burmese, very successfully showing one of their pride and joy, Golden Oldie lilac spay CCCA Ch, GDGC & ACT TGC Rosepark Snowdrop. Both Chris and Brenda have been actively involved in the Burmese Cat Society of Australasia for many years. Currently Chris is serving as the Society's Burmese Show Manager. He is also an elected member of the NSW CFA Management Committee



### ■ Garry Stephens (NSWCFA)

I have been a Companion cat judge since 2000 and really enjoy judging this group. In 1983 I began showing two Burmese cats originally purchased as pets and in that year one of them Amaryllis Meggie won RAS Shorthair Spay Cat of the Year. So started my involvement in cat showing and breeding, and a little later show management and club administration. While I have specialized in Burmese and more recently in Maine Coons my experience as a steward since 1986 has given me a good appreciation of all breeds.



I firmly believe that good health and temperament are essential to making a good pet as well as a good show cat. This was my prime motivation in becoming a Companion cat judge where cleanliness, condition, appearance, and temperament are the key judging criteria.



## SHOW HAPPENINGS

- ★ The Show will be a 3 ring Australian open style judging show for Burmese & Companion Cats & kittens.
- ★ You may elect to not enter an exhibit in one or more of the rings. Please mark this on your entry form for the exhibit concerned.
- ★ All exhibits will be benched in catalogue order, and judged from the same cage. The exhibits are to be benched with white curtains and bases. Coloured curtains may be displayed once judging in all rings is completed.
- ★ Litter kittens, entered in the age classes, will be judged from the litter cage, so you will not need to provide separate curtains.
- ★ **Top Burmese Exhibits:**  
Independently each ring judge will select and present their five (5) best exhibits
- ★ **Brown/Lilac Colour Class (not tortie)**  
Eligible exhibits will be entered automatically. The Top 5 exhibits in this class will be awarded special prizes
- ★ **Top 3 Companion Exhibits in Show:**  
Independently each ring judge will select their five (5) best exhibits and place them in rank order. These rankings will be passed to the Show Secretary who will
  - total the rankings of each exhibit included, and
  - list the exhibits in order of total rank.The Top 3 Exhibits in this list will be the **Top 3 Exhibits in Show.**
- ★ **Miscellaneous Classes**  
**For Burmese**, for each Miscellaneous Class
  - head type • eye colour & shape
  - coat colour & condition • purrsonalityprizes will be awarded to the best kitten, best entire cat and best desexed cat.  
In addition the overall best exhibit in each class will be awarded a special Trophy.  
**For Companions**, for each Miscellaneous Class
  - most appealing face • best groomed
  - most appealing coat colour/markings
  - purrsonalityprizes will be awarded to the best kitten and best cat.
- ★ **Kittens For Sale**  
An area for advertising your Burmese kittens for sale on the day will be available near the door in order to help potential buyers find you easily.
- ★ There will be several stalls for you to peruse, including the **Society's Burmese Merchandise Stall.**

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- An official NSW C.F.A. entry form must be completed and forwarded. [form on the back of the summary sheet]
- As indicated on the form, for each exhibit entered a legible copy of the exhibit's 4 generation pedigree, as issued by a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF, must be attached.

**The summary sheet** which accompanies this schedule must be completed and forwarded also.

An exhibitor resident in NSW must be a current financial member of NSW C.F.A. Inc. However

- A new exhibitor resident in NSW may show 3 times as a non-member provided any exhibit(s) shown is/are registered in the exhibitor's name with NSW C.F.A. Inc.

- An exhibitor resident in another state/territory/country must be a member of a controlling body recognised by CCCA or ACF in that state/territory/country and the exhibit(s) entered registered in the exhibitor's name with that controlling body.

**Vaccination Requirements:**

Each kitten exhibit must have had at least one Feline 3 vaccination not less than 14 days prior to the Show.

Documentary evidence of vaccination must be produced to the veterinary officer. Failure to do so shall result in rejection of the exhibit concerned.

All exhibits must have their front & back claws clipped

**ONLY PAPER OR OZ-PET LITTER MAY BE USED**

**All cats/kittens must remain on exhibition in show cages until 4.00 p.m.** unless permission to leave early has been granted prior to the show by the Show Manager.

The Show Secretary reserves the right to transfer exhibits which are incorrectly entered.

**Returned Cheques:** Should any cheque forwarded in payment be returned unpaid, a money order, a bank cheque, or cash will be required to be forwarded immediately to ensure acceptance of entry. Any costs incurred by the Society in such a circumstance shall be paid by the exhibitor before the entry is processed.

Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the venue.

**Cancellations** We ask for your co-operation in notifying the Show Secretary of cancellations before 12.00 noon Saturday 13th February (where possible).

**Exhibitors are reminded:**

A Judge or Steward does not have to handle any exhibit showing signs of aggression. Owners have a duty of care not to bench exhibits with a reported history of fractious behaviour. Show Managers and the Show Committee, in consultation with the Show Representative, have the right to require the removal of the latter exhibits from the Show.

### Burmese Kittens/Litters Cage Areas

Both exhibitors and the public will not be permitted to enter the kittens/litters cage areas whilst any kitten judging is taking place. **This requirement will be strictly enforced.**
